## Holiday Tree Recycling

Recycle your bare holiday trees in 2024: January 2 + January 4 January 9 + January 11 The three seats will each be up for three-year terms ending in 2027. Members of the Board are all volunteers; the positions are not compensated.

The Fairlington Villages Board of Directors is an all-volunteer body of nine members who each represent the entire community with a designated constituency for purposes of the election: community-wide (three) and each Ward (six). Board Directors serve as fiduciaries for Fairlington Villages. The Board typically meets the first Wednesday of each month at 7 p.m.

#### **CANDIDACY CRITERIA**

Candidates must be a unit owner in Fairlington Villages; be current with condo fee payments; and except for the At Large seat, own a unit in the Ward in which they are running. Candidacy petitions will be reviewed to confirm eligibility and certified by the Board at its Wed., Feb. 7, 2024, meeting. Homeowners may obtain election rules at the Management Office. For more details on how to become a candidate or questions about the election process, please contact the Management Office.

## New Charging Station at Lot 29

We are pleased to announce the installation of a new dual electric vehicle charging station in Parking Lot 29 located at 4842-4882 S. 28th St. The fast charging station includes two parking spots behind 4878 S. 28th St. and can quickly charge a vehicle. Please register with the Management Office if you would like to use it.

The charging rates are as follows: FVAC residents at \$0.30 per kWh and South Fairlington Residents at \$0.40 per kWh. After your vehicle is charged, you have 30 minutes to remove it from the charging station. After the 30 minute grace period, you will be charged \$2.00 per hour until you remove your vehicle from the station.

## **Pruning Landscaping Practices**

Yew trees are the large dark green evergreens that dot the property of Fairlington Villages. Many are used as foundation plantings along our buildings.

You may have noticed that the yews are not being shaved into smooth shapes as they have been; as a result, they may look like they need a hair trim. This lack of pruning is a conscious decision. It is healthier for plants to grow in their natural shape, and frequent trimming causes stress on plants. A yew's natural shape is still pleasing to view, but it will take some time for their "hair" to grow out and look better.

## Tree Survey Completed

In 2022, the Grounds Committee began the search for a company to do a professional tree survey which would include all of the trees on the property. In the spring of 2023, ArborPro was selected as the software provider, as well as the provider of the arborist to perform the initial survey.

In late October 2023, the tree survey was conducted over a period of two weeks. A total of 2,726 trees were surveyed among the six wards. Over 90 distinct species were recorded in the database, which indicates excellent diversity in the overall tree canopy. The most common tree species in Fairlington Villages is the Eastern White Pine.

The ArborPro software will be used as a management tool to keep data and maintenance records on each tree. The investment in this software is the first step of an Urban Forestry Master Plan being developed by the Grounds Committee. Below are the tree totals by ward:

#### Ad Hoc Turf Care Alternatives Committee Is Underway

The Ad Hoc Turf Care Alternatives Committee has begun meeting and welcomes your participation. This committee is studying how we can have the beautiful lawns we expect to see in Fairlington Villages, while reducing the effects of chemicals and fossil fuels on our environment and our health.

Some of the Best Management Practices for healthy turf the committee will investigate include: allowing grass to grow longer to approximately four inches; incorporating cost-effective and passive alternatives to chemicals; reducing the frequency of cutting during cover alternatives where grass struggles to survive, like deep shade areas and steep hillsides. #### Clear the Air

Management continues to receive complaints about the transference of smoking odors from cigarettes and marijuana.

If you are a smoker or allow smoking in your unit, please make every attempt to ensure that your unit is sealed (common walls, outlets, behind appliances, etc.) to minimize the transference of smoke and smoke odors. Non-smoker unit owners are also encouraged to take such measures.

Other mitigation measures that can be effective:

- 1. Use an air purifier.
- 2. Place a wet towel at the bottom of your door to prevent the smoke and odor from entering the hallway.
- For marijuana consumers, consult your prescribing physician to determine whether edibles may be an effective and non-intrusive delivery method in lieu of smoking.

#### Four Days to Recycle Holiday Trees in January

Fairlington Villages participates in the tree recycling program with Arlington County to keep holiday trees out of the landfill. Please hold your trees until collection by Capitol Services begins on Tues., Jan. 2. Follow these easy steps on these four dates:

- Place your tree curbside by 12 p.m.: Tues., Jan. 2; Thurs., Jan. 4; Tues., Jan. 9; and Thurs., Jan. 11.
- For your tree to be recycled, Arlington County requires the tree be clean of any decoration.
- If you used a bag, remove the bag once you get the bare tree to the curb.
- If you live in an apartment building, please remove any needles and debris from the stairwell and hallways, as they are difficult for the cleaning crew to remove with their vacuum.

#### Leaf Removal Needs To Be Bagged for Thursday

Contracted leaf removal on the property has been completed for the season; throwing or raking leaves into the common area is no longer permitted.

## **Board Meeting Highlights**

The Board held a regular meeting on Dec. 6, 2023. The following are highlights.

**Old Business** 

A. Variance Request – 4900 S. 29th Rd. – Install Google Nest Cam with Flood Lights in the Location of a Carriage Light: Mr. Brown moved the Board approve a variance request to install a security camera with flood lights on a second floor balcony in accordance with the specifications outlined in the variance request. Failed 4-5.

Mr. Brown moved the Board agree that enforcement of the denial of the Variance Request for 4900 S. 29th Rd. to install a Google Nest Cam with flood lights in the location of the current jelly jar fixture, be delayed pending further study. Passed 9-0.

**B. Standards of Care for Leaf Blowing:** Mr. Torres moved the Board agree to discuss standards of care for leaf blowing with the landscape service provider. Passed 9-0.

#### **New Business**

A. Rules Violation – 2930 S. Buchanan St., C-2: Mr. Brown moved that having conducted the Hearing and following the review and evaluation of all evidence, argument and/or comments presented to the Board of Directors, the Board finds that there is a violation of the Association's By-Laws, and hereby assesses Mr. Richard Buangan, owner of 2930 S. Buchanan St., C-2, \$50 for the Rules Violation noted in the letters dated June 6, 2023; June 29, 2023; and July 3, 2023. Failed 0-9.

B. Variance Request – 4861-A S. 28th St. – Removal of Kitchen Load-Bearing Wall: Ms. Lankford moved the Board approve a variance request to remove a loadbearing wall and non-load-bearing wall in the kitchen, in accordance with the specifications outlined in the variance request. Passed 9-0.

C. Variance Request – 4882-B S. 28th St. – Removal of Kitchen Load-Bearing Wall: Ms. Dies moved the Board approve a variance request to remove a loadbearing wall and non-load-bearing wall in the kitchen, in accordance with the specifications outlined in the variance request. Passed 9-0.

D. Variance Request – 2917 S. Buchanan St. – Removal of Kitchen Load-Bearing Wall: Mr. Brown moved the Board approve a variance request to remove a loadbearing wall and non-load-bearing wall in the kitchen, in accordance with the specifications outlined in the variance request. Passed 9-0.

E. Variance Request – 4837 S. 27 Rd. – Relocate Refrigerant Line: Ms. Valpone moved the Board approve a variance request to relocate the refrigerant line, in accordance with the specifications outlined in the variance request. Passed 8-0-1.

E2. Variance Request – 2994
S. Columbus St., A-2 – Installation of Pavers in the Common
Elements: Ms. Alvord moved the
Board approve a variance request
for the installation of pavers in the
common elements in accordance
with the specifications outlined in
the variance request. Passed 8-1.

F. Multiunit Interior Renovation Committee Recommendation: Ms. Alvord moved the Board accept the recommendation of the Interior Renovation Committee and authorize Management to contract with Lee Design in the amount of \$10,000 to prepare three design palettes that will be presented to the Board of Directors and the community for consideration. Passed 9-0.

G. Replacement of Common Area Windows Wards V and VI: Ms. Alvord moved the Board authorize Management to contract with NOVA Installations for the replacement of 65 windows in the common area hallways in Wards V and VI, per the proposal, at a cost not to exceed \$34,775. Passed 9-0.

H. Workers' Compensations Insurance Renewal: Mr. Reem moved the Board authorize Holden & Company Insurance, to bind Workers' Compensation Insurance for the period Dec. 18, 2023, through Dec. 18, 2024, with the Hanover Insurance Group as outlined in their 2023-2024 Workers Compensation Insurance proposal dated Nov. 17, 2023. Passed 9-0.

I. Election Rules: Ms. Alvord moved the Board adopt the following revision to rule 7(b) of the Election Rules: "The Fairlington Villages sign policy is waived for candidates wishing to post signs for a candidate event for up to 24 hours. Candidates may also hand distribute flyers. , but the While flyers may not be left unattended upon the common elements or posted in the multi-unit buildings but they may be left unattended outside the main door on two prescribed weekends." Passed 7-2.

J. Pool House III Renovation: Mr. Reem moved the Board approve the proposal from American Restoration for Pool House III renovation at a cost not to exceed \$193,600. Prior to approval of the resolution, Mr. Brown moved to amend the motion by removing construction of an entrance pergola from the plan. The amendment was adopted 9-0, and the amended motion passed 9-0.

K. Resident Handbook Revision: Eighth Edition 01-01-2021, Page 51: Decorations, Decorative Items in Limited Common Areas and Shared Common Areas: Ms. Weaver moved the Board extend the period for which exterior Halloween decorations are permitted from Oct. 15 to Nov. 8, Passed 8-0.
